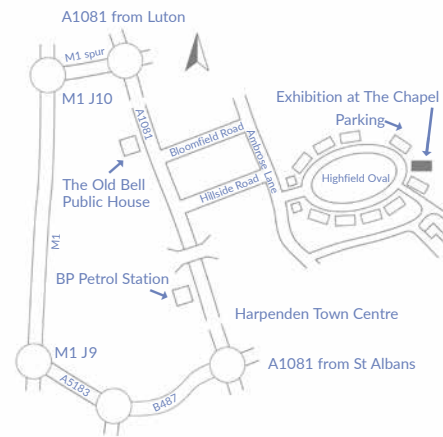


Rory's rich and vibrant landscapes have gained international as well as national recognition. His work resides in public and private collections both here in the UK

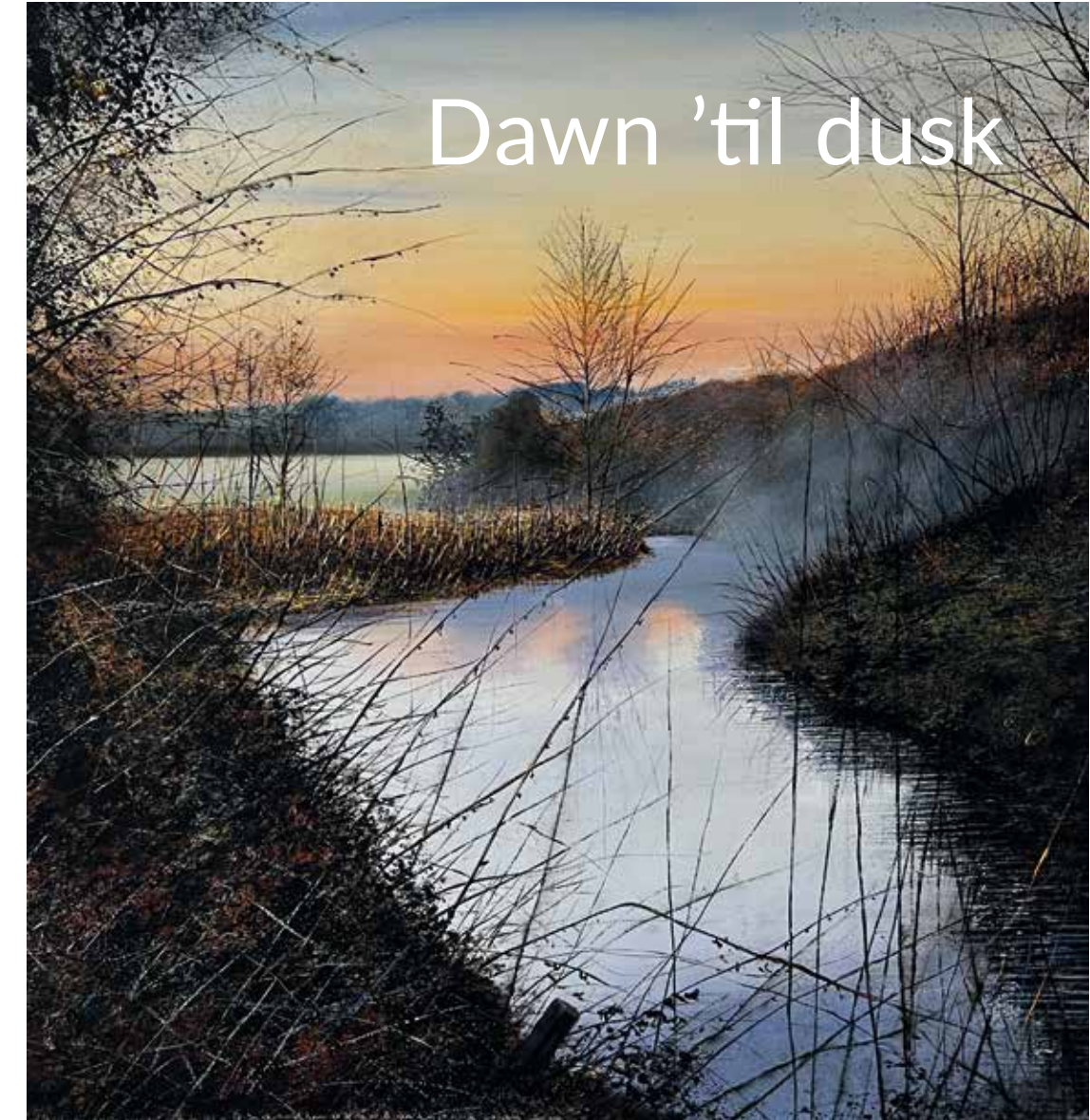

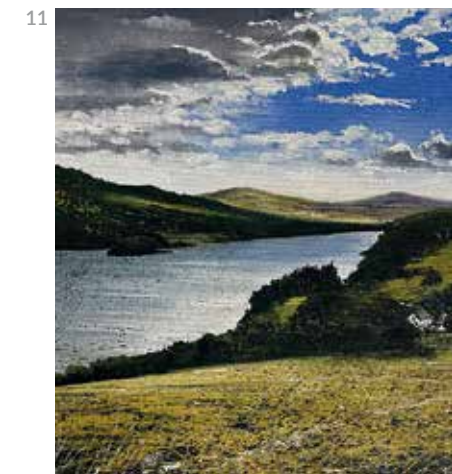
8 Scree slope

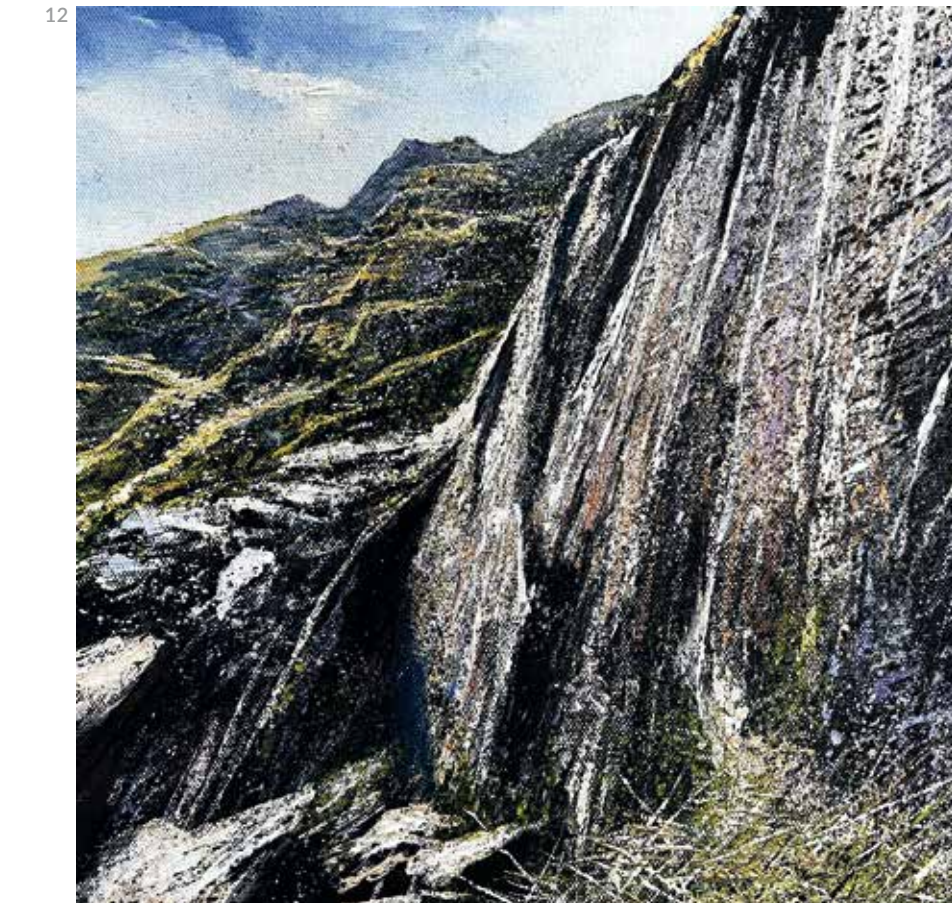
9 Ridge pathway
